

Ag Fact: Demeter, Greek goddess of agriculture

In Greek mythology, Demeter is the goddess of agriculture, harvest, bread, grain, and the cycle of seasons. She is also called the "Grain-Mother" or the "Earth-Mother" and is believed to sustain mankind with the earth's rich bounty. Demeter was depicted as a mature woman, often wearing a crown and bearing sheafs of wheat or a cornucopia, and a torch. Demeter's sacred plants were wheat, barley, and the poppy.
